## St. Anne's Vestry Meeting November 17, 2020

\*Meeting held by Zoom videoconference\*

1. OPENING PRAYER - Fr. Lonnie opened the meeting with prayer.

2. FORMATION – Fr. Lonnie led the group in a discussion of Matthew 25:31-46 focusing on what this passage teaches us about our spiritual need to give, how it challenges us, and the good news it reveals.

Jesus said, "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' Then he will say to those at his left hand, 'You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me.' Then they also will answer, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?' Then he will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me.' And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

#### 3. DISCUSSION

- a. Consecration Sunday Stewardship Chair Jenna Claire Riddle shared plans for the day.
  - Outside in-person services will be held at 9 a.m., 10 a.m., and 11 a.m. employing the same set up used for the All Saints Day service on November 1.
    - Each service will end with an invitation for parishioners to go
      inside the sanctuary and place pledge cards on the altar. Ushers
      will distance groups appropriately, directing each to enter the front
      doors and exit the north side door.
    - Box lunches (including brisket and chicken) will be offered outside as groups exit the church. Advent wreath supplies will also be available.
    - The Annual Meeting will be held via Zoom at 6 o'clock that evening.
  - ii. Vestry members will contact those households that have not RSVP'd. The list was divided among members. Calls should be made by this Wednesday evening and numbers reported to Jenna Claire and Parish Administrator Emily Guerry.
- b. Worship Guidelines Update Fr. Lonnie shared the updated Diocesan worship guidelines (see attachment).
- c. Worship Plans for December, January, and February After discussion and keeping in mind the current rise in COVID cases in Tift County, suggestions include:
  - i. Outside in-person services on the first Sunday of each month, December 6, January 3, and February 7. To allow temperatures to warm, services will begin at 10 a.m., 11 a.m., and noon.
  - ii. Online Morning Prayer will be held the remaining Sundays of each month.
  - iii. In-person Christmas Eve services will be held outside beginning at 5 p.m., 6 p.m., and 7 p.m.
  - iv. An in-person Epiphany Service will be held outdoors on Wednesday, January 6 beginning at 6 p.m.
- d. 2021 Budget Treasurer Shelly Scheimesser opened the floor for questions or concerns regarding the 2021 budget. There were none.
- e. 2021 Vestry Retreat The retreat is scheduled for January 9-21. Honey Creek is open and can provide appropriate social distancing. Fr. Lonnie asked that Vestry members contact him with any concerns.

a. Rector's Report – Fr. Lonnie reported the Diocese of Georgia has filed a claim with the Boy Scouts of America on behalf of all churches in the Diocese that sponsored Boy Scout troops. The Boy Scouts of America is in bankruptcy and is facing many child sexual abuse lawsuits. The Diocesan claim has not been filed for specific allegations, but in the event complaints are brought forward in the future.

The Cub Scouts troupe which St. Anne's sponsors has asked to resume activities on campus one Saturday per month. The Vestry agreed to this request pending further conversation between Fr. Lonnie and troupe leadership regarding their plans. The Bishop's Guidelines for in-person gathering should be followed and waivers should be signed.
